

Church of Saint Andrew

In the Old Testament scriptures of the Jewish tradition, the one person of God was well known, sought and described. In the beginning of the New Testament, in the Gospel of Saint John, Jesus is introduced,

*In the beginning was the Word: the Word was with God and the Word was God.
He was with God in the beginning.*

*Through him all things came into being, not one thing came into being except through him.
What has come into being in him was life, life that was the light of men;
and light shines in darkness, and darkness could not overpower it. (John 1:1-3)*

Jesus came into the world which already well acknowledged the existence of a single God who declared in his 1st commandment transmitted to the people through Moses,

*"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.
You shall have no other gods before me." (Exodus 20:2)*

yet Jesus later in his teachings to the peoples indicated that

"Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father." (John 14:9)

and would go on to introduce the "comforter", in today's gospel and just before His departure from this world (Acts 1:7), and as heard last Sunday at Pentecost,

*"the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name,
will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you." (John 14:26)
"the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth." (John 20:13)*

Three distinct persons in a God who, by definition, is one, is the cornerstone of the theology of a Trinity, a conclusion not seen in the Bible, but determined years after the departure by Jesus from the world, which continues to this day integral in our understanding and relationship with our creator.

Each has a distinct role of influence in our lives, yet they share the same one spirit based on truth, love and empowerment of creation, into which we all are invited to join in our temporal lives in this world.

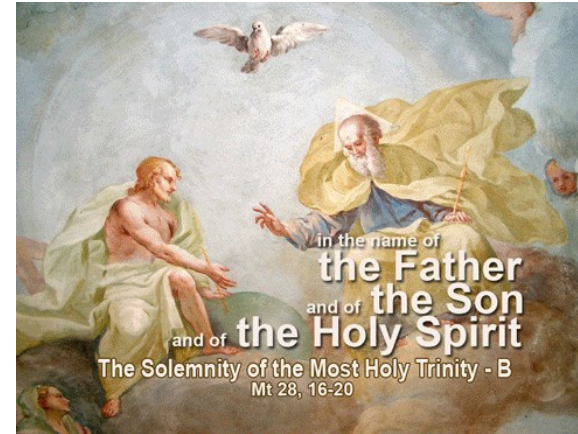
But when he comes,
